Special events for Women, Jrs, and Kids. You must choose one and only one class to race in. Same venue as in 2006, approximately 600' course containing 50+ cones.

### **Dual Tight Slalom:**

Sunday 8/25 (8AM - 6PM), Longmont, CO – Dual Tight Slalom. Competitors will each have 2 qualifying runs. After qualifying, Top 16 in Pro and Top 32 in Open will advance to dual eliminations. Special events for Women, Jrs, and Kids. You must choose one and only one class to race in. Venue may be same as in 2006 or a similar hill, approximately 600' course containing 70+ cones.
