

ISSA REQUIRED STEPS TOWARDS WORLD SKATE

Following the 2020 December assembly meeting, ISSA shall submit to World Skate:

The time frame for a transition period of the affiliation process to World Skate Slalom

- The period will start after having agreed on the process and should not be longer than 18 months. This will allow us to get to the World Skate Games with a clear international structure for the sport.
- During and after this period, the “ISSA” will cease to be referred to in any way as a governing body for Slalom Skateboarding. Should ISSA continue to exist, it shall function and present itself only as a competition organizer/promoter.
- World Skate shall be the only Governing Body for Slalom (since this discipline is part of Skateboarding as a sport, in general).

Nominations for:

- World Skate Slalom Working group members, their competences and contacts
- Any other relevant contacts needed for further cooperation between ISSA and World Skate during the transition period along with their listed competences

Documents related to the organization structure:

- **Statutes**, by-laws, Code of Conduct, and Code of Ethics applicable for the functioning (general and aligned with WS)
- **Competition Rules** and other used standards (age, gender, tier, etc. categories)
- **Ranking Rules** & point allocation system for World Skate Slalom Ranking (WSSR)

World Skate will:

1. *Officially announce the merger of ISSA in World Skate* and communicate it to all NGBs
2. Official Appointment of the World Skate Slalom working group
3. Review and alignment of the submitted documents for World Skate compliance
4. Start releasing Slalom related contents
5. Release of the Slalom documents
6. Release of the Slalom competition calendar
7. Organize a Slalom Webinar to introduce NGB to the “new” discipline
8. Promote the inclusion of SL SB among the NGB
9. Add Slalom SB to the World Skate Games (BA 2022) event program

- Start the usual work and all needed processes for the fusion
