## Contest Description:

The Wiggle War is a CHARITY EVENT. 100\% of the racer's entry fees goes to the Colinial Club Senior Center in Sun Prairie, WI. (www.colonialclub.org). We have 3 races at 3 separate locations over 2 days. The races are racer-friendly and encourage $1^{\text {st }}$ timers to come out and give it a try. However, each year we draw a fair amount of the midwest's top racers too, so there is plenty of top-end action for those prepared to compete at that level. The more experienced racers are always quick with advice and tips for the beginners. We all bring more than one board so the new-comers can experiment with different setups and get a feel what a slalom board is.

## Race Event \#1 description:

All 3 events take palce in residential sections of Sun Prairie.
Saturday morning; Straight/tight - Nearly flat stretch of road 30-40 cones @ 6'. Dual lane. Start ramps. Everyone gets two qualifying runs, one in each lane. Based on qualifiers, adults are divided in to $A$ \& $B$ classes. Normal bracketing is used for the racing.
The juniors course is set at $8^{\prime}$, and they have the option to push-start instead of ramp start.
This is the most recognized event as it happens right at the Colonial Club location at the height of Strawberry Fest. Little used dead-end road. Good surface.
Saturday afternoon; Hybid - Straight, moderately steep hill a little more than a block long. Recently repaved. Great shape. Deadend at the bottom with a big turnaround circle. Dual lane. Start ramps. We don't re-qualify for this race. A \& B classes remain the same. Junior's class runs he bottom half of the course only. No ramp start for the juniors.

Sunday morning; G/S - Long hill with an s-curve. Steep at the top and bottom with a not-as-steep section in the middle. We measured it at 800' from start ramp to last cone the $1^{\text {st }}$ year we ran there. Also excellent surface. No cracks. Single lane. Start ramp. We don't requalify for this race. Juniors run the bottom half of the course.
