Race Event #1 description:

Type: TS

Cone Spacing: 1.50-1.90

Number of Cones: 30-40

Slope: The road we have been allocated this year is similar to the road used in Thawil for the Airflow Slalombrunch. The surface is moderately smooth asphalt again similar to that in Thalwil.

The course will be set on the Friday afternoon before the race by Louis Selby and 1 other rider.

Race Event #2 description:

Type: HS

Cone Spacing: 1.70-3.00

Number of Cones: 50 - 60

This event takes place on the Sunday on a big wide sloping road that runs the length of the showground and proved very successful last year.
